

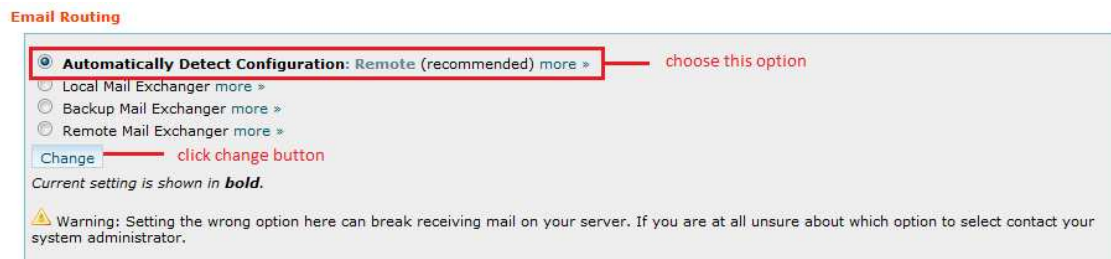
GOOGLE APPS FOR YOUR BUSINESS

Configuring MX Records at cPanel...

First, you need to configure the MX records for your domain. Login into your cPanel account and choose MX Entry Maintenance from Email Management Tools option.



The MX Entry page will be shown and change the followings.



Next enter your MX record.

Add New Record

Register the domain for Google Apps

Once you have configured the domain MX records, you will need to register your domain for Google Apps.

But you will required to create a HTML verification file named **googlehostedservice.html** , copy the text specified below into it, and upload it to your ftp with your unique string inside it.
